Clean-up and Maintenance at Striker

Two or three staff will be there regularly and will be responsible for:

- Daily maintenance: restroom, trash receptacles, and basic clean up.
- Graffiti. The standard paint colors are stored there.
- Mowing once a week in the summer, even twice in growing season.



Other work has specialized crews: mowing the meadow, attending to the bark trail, and maintaining the stormwater facilities .

Striker Milkweed Patch Graduates to Pollinator Patch

Our milkweed patch now has several new pollinators: potentilla, yarrow, Hall's aster, and sidalcea, a kind of checkermallow. They'll bloom in spring and summer and attract butterflies and bees and other beneficial insects. The milkweed that's essential to monarch butterflies remains the star. It used to be plentiful here, but development has plowed most of it under.



Eugene has larger sites preserving native habitat, but very few small, local ones like ours. They need continuous help warding off invasive species. Head north on the path through the park to find ours. Signage explains how it works.

A group of neighbors, working with Joe Waksmundski from Parks and Open Spaces, are doing the planting and weeding.
